TOM'S LANDING

Spot where you step ashore for exploration and fun on the island.



FISHING PIER

Borrow one of Huckleberry Finn's favorite poles and a can of worms if you like to fish for river perch and catfish.



• INJUN JOE'S CAVE

Where Tom Sawyer and Becky Thatcher wrote their names with candle smoke. Explore the labyrinth of passages...look for the fossils in the walls...the colorful strata...crawl through secret tunnels...discover the hiding place of Injun Joe's treasure "under the cross"...

Glistening stalactites and stalagmites form fantastic shapes in the Chamber of the Bottomless Pit...Some have said that from the depths they have heard the mournful sound of Injun Joe, crying out in the darkness...but others claim it is just the wind moaning in some lost subterranean passage.



FORT WILDERNESS

At the far end of Wilderness Road stands Fort Wilderness—the outpost of civilization. The time is of the War of 1812...the United States flag has only 15 stars.

Within the gates there is a Canteen and Trading Post—stocked with pelts, guns, knives and Indian craft.

In the Regimental Hdqrs., Davy Crockett and George Russell, U.S. Army Scouts, can be seen reporting to Maj. General Andrew Jackson during the Cherokee Indian Campaign.

From the parapets and block houses can be seen the vast untamed American wilderness...with deer, moose, bear and wildlife of the primitive forest.

Beyond the stockade are tepees...hostile Indians on the warpath. A settler's cabin burns furiously in the distance...mute evidence of a treacherous attack.

SUSPENSION BRIDGE

Leaving Fort Wilderness via Wilderness Trail you reach the Suspension Bridge, swung high above Smuggler's Cove...Beyond this swaying footbridge is the path to Point Lookout.

From this point emanate 3 waterfalls, the headwaters of the Rivers of America...far below streams the river traffic of keel boats, sternwheeler and Indian war canoes.



THE OLD MILL

The massive overshot wheel of the old grist mill, turned by a tumbling stream of water channeled in a wooden flume, typifies the pioneer's ingenious use of water power.
