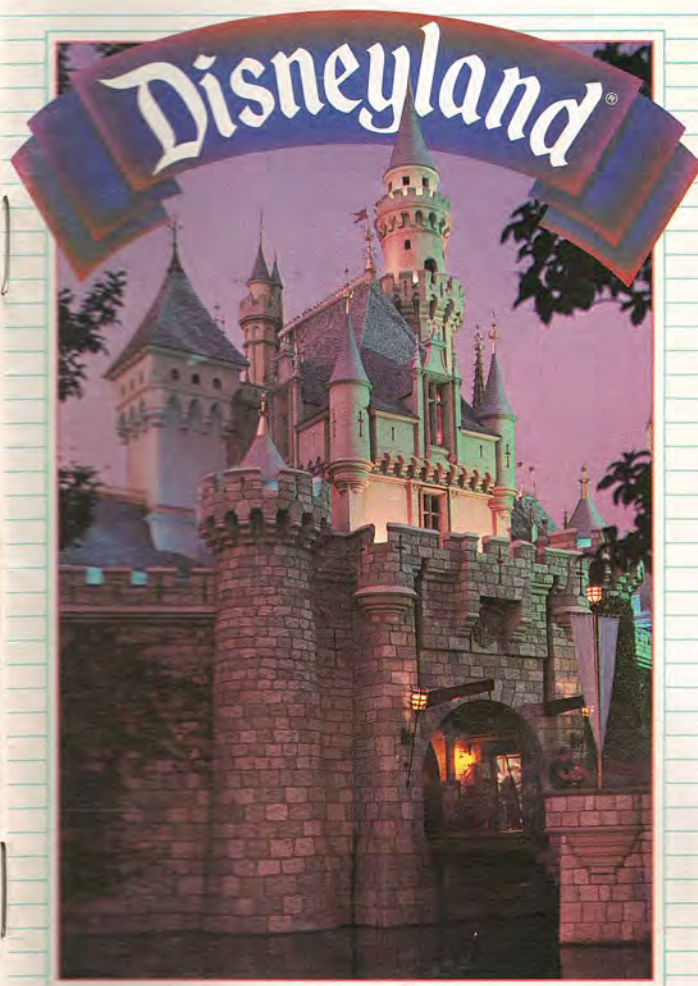

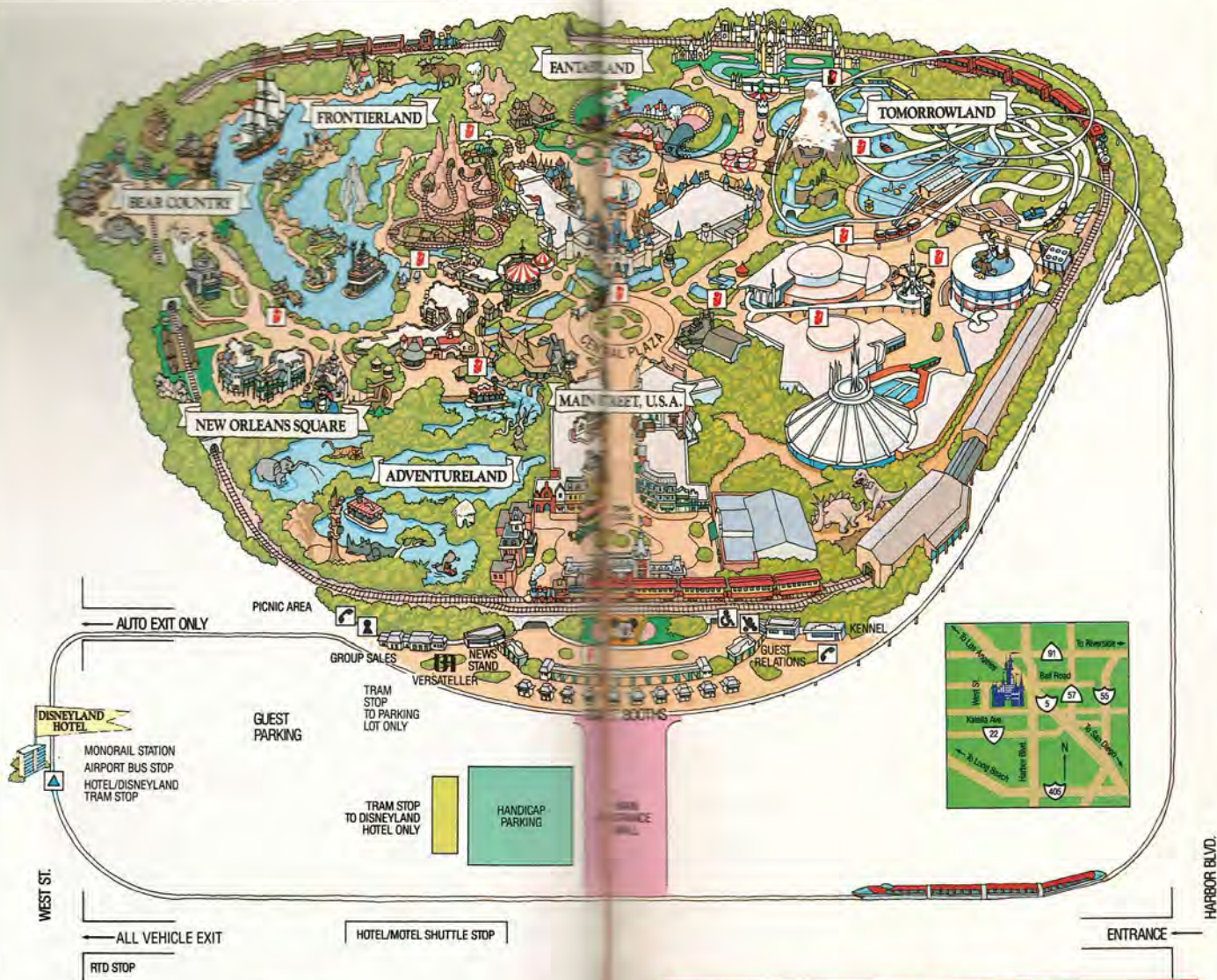

We advise Disneyland guests to phone or write for exact information concerning, hours, events and performers scheduled to appear, parade or performance times, ticket prices, etc., when planning a trip to Disneyland. Hours are subject to change without notice. Contact Disneyland Guest Relations, P.O. Box 3232, Anaheim, CA 92803, phone (714) 999-4565.

Disneyland general information may be obtained from CITY HALL on Town Square (messages may be left for lost guests). General information about other Southern California recreational attractions and public transportation schedules may be obtained from The Card Corner at the end of Main Street.

During your visit, feel free to ask any Cast Member for assistance.

American Express

Your American Express card is the official credit card of Disneyland and is accepted in many shops, restaurants and at the Main Entrance for admission.

Baby Center presented by Gerber

Located between The Card Corner and First Aid just off Main Street. Facilities for preparing formulas, warming bottles, breast feeding and changing infants. Disposable diapers and a limited selection of strained baby food is also available at the Market House on Main Street. Sorry, babysitting not available.

Banking Services

Bank of America, located on Town Square, provides banking facilities from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. every day. A Versateller is located to the left of the Park Entrance. Check cashing, up to \$20 with proper identification, is available at the Penny Arcade on Main Street and the Starcade in Tomorrowland.

Most Disneyland shops and restaurants will accept travelers and personal checks, with proper identification, and major credit cards, for the amount of purchase only.

Mailing of your purchased items available at most merchandise facilities throughout Disneyland.

First Aid

Registered nurse on duty at all times. Located at the end of Main Street next to the Plaza Inn.

Storage Lockers presented by National Car Rental

Facilities for checking purchases and garments are located between the Fire Station and the Emporium on Town Square, Main Street.

Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Parking Lot Tram Stop, west of the Disneyland Main Entrance Ticket Booths.

Pet Care Kennel presented by Gaines

With the exception of seeing-eye dogs, pets are not permitted in Disneyland. The Kennel is located to the far right of the Main Entrance. Food and water provided upon request. Daily charges apply to Park operating hours; sorry, no overnight accommodations.

Lost and Found

Facilities for lost and found items are furnished between the Emporium and the Fire Station on Town Square, Main Street.

Lost Children

Facilities for the care of lost children are maintained within First Aid at the end of Main Street, next to the Plaza Inn.

Handicapped Guests

Accommodations have been made throughout Disneyland for our disabled guests. For specific information please be sure to get a copy of our Handicap Guest Guide at The Card Corner or Wheelchair and Stroller Center. Wheelchairs/strollers are available for rental just inside the Main Entrance for a nominal charge and refundable deposit.

Please Note:

Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times. We request that no food or beverages be brought into Disneyland. A picnic area is located to the left of the Main Entrance for your convenience. We ask that there be no flash photography, eating, drinking or smoking in any attraction. Thank you.

Disneyland Tickets

Disneyland Tickets

There are several ways to enjoy Disneyland, each designed to fit your individual needs.

Passport and Guided Tour tickets may be purchased at the Main Entrance Ticket Booths and the Monorail Station at the Disneyland Hotel. Inside Disneyland, Guided Tour tickets are also sold at City Hall and the Penny Arcade. You will need Passports for children (ages 3-12) and adults. Children 2 and under are free. Children under 7 must be accompanied by an adult on all attractions. Major credit cards accepted.

Unlimited Passports

The one, two or three-day Passport gives unlimited use of Disneyland adventures and attractions (except Arcades), with one convenient ticket that's your Passport to fun.

Guided Tours

Recommended for first-time guests and the visitor with a limited amount of time. The Guided Tour is your key to the seven realms of Disneyland. On the three and one-half hour tour, you will experience several of our exciting attractions and discover little-known facts about Disneyland—its history and its creator, Walt Disney. Foreign language tours (subject to availability) and advance reservations for groups of 15 persons or more are

suggested by calling (714) 999-4573. Handicapped guests are welcome on Guided Tours. Unlimited Passport not included in Guided Tour ticket.

NOTE: Tour time subject to wait time on attractions.

Senior Fun Days

Any Senior, age 60 or over, can purchase a special Unlimited Passport at a reduced price every Monday through Friday. Ask at the Ticket Booth for details.

Insiders' Tips on Making Your Visit More Pleasant

These suggestions will help save time, energy and footsteps while you enjoy all there is to see and do during your visit to Disneyland.

Attractions

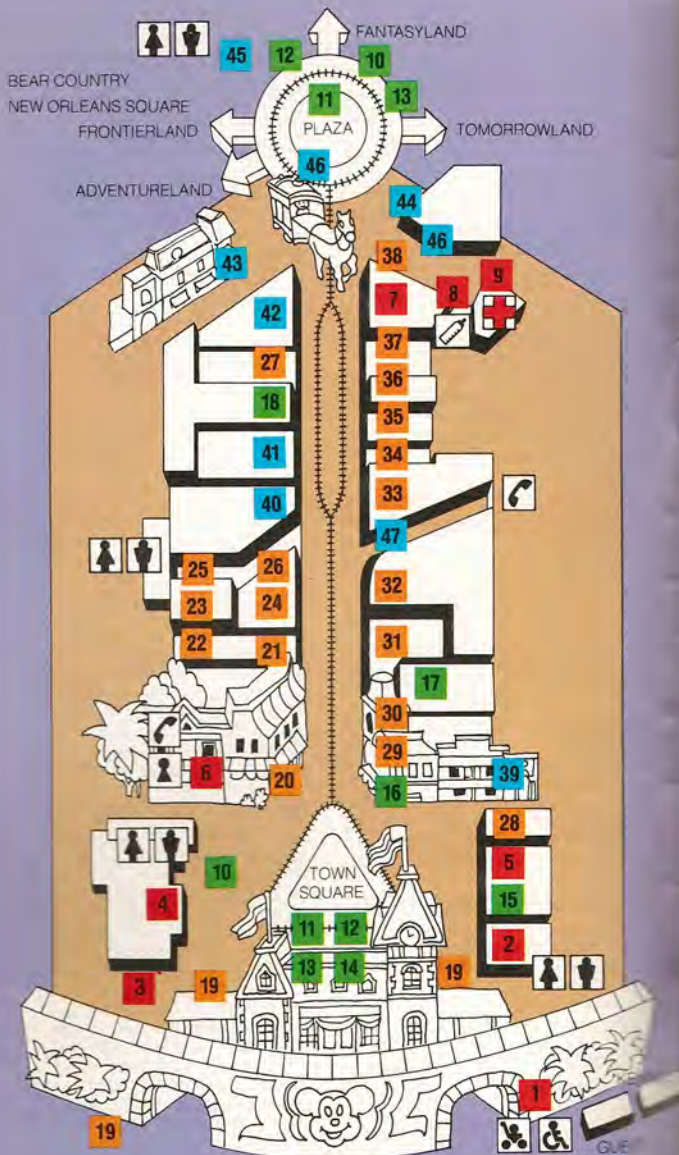
No matter what the season, the best time to see our most popular attractions is early in the day (before noon) or just before Park closing. Let the descriptions listed on pages 5-19 help you decide which attractions you wish to see. We suggest you begin with a train trip around Disneyland and then proceed to the attractions of your choice using the inside map as a guide. Your Passport will enable you to experience a variety of attractions and adventures.

Re-Entry to Disneyland

If you wish to leave Disneyland and return during regular operating hours on the same day, you must have your hand stamped at the designated turnstile and use the "Re-entry" turnstile on return. You may re-enter the parking lot, free of charge, during regular Park operating hours on the same day if you retain your parking ticket and present it at the Guest Parking Entrance upon your return. Disneyland Hotel guests and visitors, exiting by way of the Disneyland Monorail Hotel Station, must have their hands stamped as they exit to re-enter during regular Park operating hours on the same day.

Disney Characters

Disney Characters may appear at many different locations throughout Disneyland. They have no specific schedule, so keep your eyes open. They could surprise you at any time!

Kodak Picture Tips

for Disneyland®

1. For sharp pictures, hold your camera steady as you gently press the shutter release.

2. Add a feeling of depth to your pictures by "framing" the subject with a foreground object such as an arch or tree branch.

3. Personalize your pictures by including friends or family members in the foreground.

4. For natural pictures of people have them involved in a fun activity rather than staring at the camera.

5. Make title pictures for your picture story by photographing identifying signs.

6. Concentrate attention on your main subject by moving in close enough for it to fill the entire viewfinder (check your camera manual for the minimum subject distance).

7. You may want to capture interesting details of subjects by moving in close. With the close-up setting on some Kodak disc cameras you can get as close as 18 inches.

8. For good flash pictures be sure to keep your subject within the flash distance range for your camera. Flashes are not functional for subjects beyond 50 feet, such as fireworks.

9. If you have a 35mm camera, you can photograph outdoor subjects after sundown and indoor subjects using fast films, such as KODACOLOR VR 400 Films (set exposure meter at 400) and KODACOLOR VR 1000 Films (set exposure meter at 1000).
