

DISNEYLAND PARK



Obtain general information at Disneyland Park's **City Hall** on the west side of Town Square. Information about public transportation (including schedules) and other Southern California attractions is available at **Carefree Corner** on the east end of Main Street.

If you need assistance during your visit, feel free to ask any Disneyland Cast Member. He or she will be more than glad to help you.

For further information about hours, entertainment events and Passport and ticket prices, write or call Disneyland Guest Relations, P.O. Box 3232, Anaheim, CA 92803, (714)999-4565.

Disneyland Tickets and Passports

Purchase your One, Two or Three-Day Disneyland Passports and Child Passports (for ages 3-11) at any Main Entrance ticket booth. Visa, MasterCard and American Express are accepted. Children two and under are admitted free.

Each Passport provides unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except Arcades). Young children should be accompanied by an adult on all attractions.

Senior Fun Passport

If you're a senior 60 or over, purchase a reduced-price Passport any day of the week, except Saturday, from September through June.

Additional discounts are available through the Magic Years Club, which offers travel and leisure benefits to seniors. For more information, write or call Disney's Magic Years Club, P.O. Box 4709, Anaheim, CA 92803, (714)490-3250.

Seasonal Passport

The Seasonal Passport gives you admission to Disneyland Park and use of all attractions during selected seasonal periods. Check with Disneyland Guest Relations for complete details.

Annual Passport

The Disneyland Annual Passport, good during regular operating hours, offers you unlimited admission to Disneyland, use of all attractions, plus free parking for one year.

Ticket media and programs subject to change without notice.

Guided Tours

If it's your first time to Disneyland Park or you have a limited amount of time, we'd like to recommend our three-and-a-half-hour guided tour. Discover little known facts about Walt Disney and his Magic Kingdom and experience several attractions with your Disneyland host or hostess.


Foreign language tours are offered (subject to availability). Advance reservations for groups of 15 or more are suggested. Please call (714)999-4573.

The Guided Tour ticket, which is not included in the unlimited use Passport, is available for purchase at City Hall.

Note: Length of tour may vary depending on wait time for attractions. Disabled guests are welcome.

Disney Dollars

Use Disney Dollars for all your buying needs throughout the Disneyland Park and the Disneyland Hotel. Available in \$1, \$5 and \$10 denominations at a one-for-one exchange rate with U.S. currency, Disney Dollars can be purchased at all ticket booths, the Main Street Penny Arcade, Tomorrowland Starcade, City Hall and the Newsstand. They are also available at the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station and at the front desk of the Disneyland Hotel. Cash in on the fun!



American Express

American Express is the Official Credit Card of Disneyland Park and is accepted at the Main Entrance and in many of the shops, stores and restaurants.

Banking Services

Bank of America, located on the east side of Town Square, provides complete banking services from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily. A Versateller is located west of the Disneyland Main Entrance.

Merchandise Services

With proper identification, you can cash checks up to \$20 at the Penny Arcade on Main Street and the Stascade in Tomorrowland.

Most Disneyland shops and restaurants accept cash, Disney Dollars, credit cards, traveler's checks and personal checks with proper identification. Personal checks may be written for the amount of purchase only.

First Aid

First Aid is located at the east end of Main Street next to the Plaza Inn. A registered nurse is on duty at all times.

Special Services for Disabled Guests

Accommodations have been made throughout Disneyland Park for disabled guests. For specific information, obtain your copy of the Disneyland **Disabled Guest Guide** at Carefree Corner or Strollers and Wheelchairs.

In this guidebook, this wheelchair symbol indicates areas where you may remain in your wheelchair at all times.

Some attractions require that you be able to leave your wheelchair.

A member of your party is necessary to assist you in and out of these attractions.

Stroller and Wheelchair Rentals

A limited number of stroller and wheelchair rentals are available for a nominal charge and refundable deposit. They are located on the east side of the Disneyland Main Entrance, just inside the gate.

Kennels

Board your pets for a nominal charge in the Disneyland Kennel, which is east of the Disneyland Main Entrance. Sorry, no facilities for overnight accommodations.

Lost and Found

Claim your lost items at Lost and Found, located on the east side of Main Street, around the corner from the Market House.

Lost Children

Pick up your lost child at the Lost Children Center, located at the east end of Main Street next to First Aid. You can also make inquiries at City Hall.

Baby Center

Located on the east end of Main Street between Carefree Corner and First Aid, the Baby Center provides facilities for preparing formulas, warming bottles, breast-feeding and changing diapers. Disposable diapers and a limited selection of baby food are also available at the Market House on Main Street. Sorry, baby-sitting is not available.



Storage Lockers

A limited number of lockers for storing garments, personal belongings and purchases are located adjacent to Lost and Found, halfway down Main Street next to the Cone Shop, and next to the Videopolis restrooms.

Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Parking Lot Tram stop, west of the Disneyland Main Entrance.

Tips to make your visit more pleasant

Enjoy your day at Disneyland Park to the fullest with these time and energy-saving suggestions:

Attractions

No matter what the season, the best time to see the most popular attractions is early in the day (before noon) and just before closing.

Also, plan on eating your meals early or late so you'll avoid the lunch and dinner rushes.

If you plan to do some shopping, don't hold off until the end of the day. The shops are usually the busiest at that time.

The descriptions on pages 6-25 will help you decide what attractions you'd like to see, where you might want to eat, and which shops you'd like to browse through. The Park map on the inside is a helpful guide.

No tickets are required on any attraction; your Passport provides unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except arcades).

Attention! Many of our attractions have show elements which contain bright flashing lights or strobe effects. Refer to this symbol . See a host or hostess for more information.

Please Note: Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times in Disneyland Park. We request that no food or beverages be brought into Disneyland Park. A picnic area is located west of the Main Entrance for your convenience. Also, for the comfort of those around you, we request that there be no flash photography, eating or drinking in any attraction. Smoking is not permitted in any attraction or waiting area. We thank you for your cooperation and consideration.

Re-entry to Disneyland Park

If you wish to leave Disneyland Park and return the same day during regular operating hours, a valid Disneyland Passport and a hand stamp are required for readmission. You may also re-enter the parking lot on the same day (free of charge) if you retain your parking ticket and present it at the Guest Parking Entrance.

Are you a Disneyland Hotel guest or visitor leaving by way of the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station? You must have a valid Disneyland Passport and a hand stamp as you exit the station if you plan to return to Disneyland Park the same day.

Disney Characters

Find Disney characters throughout Disneyland Park at any given time. You can usually see Mickey Mouse and his friends in Town Square (except during parade times). Just keep your eyes open and your camera ready.

Photo Processing by Fox Photo

Drop off your film at various locations throughout the Park and at the Disneyland Hotel for two-hour or next-day processing by Fox Photo. You may pick up your prints at the Camera Center on Main Street or Castle Sundries at the Disneyland Hotel. *Attention Young at Heart! Splash Mountain, Space Mountain, Star Tours, Matterhorn Bobslides, Big Thunder Mountain Railroad and Autopia have boarding restrictions. Guests should be in good health and free from heart, back or neck problems, motion sickness or other conditions that could be aggravated by these attractions. Expectant mothers and children under 3 should not ride. See a host or hostess at these attractions for more information.*



3 Guided Tour Garden

Start your Disneyland Guided Tour (see page 3).

4 City Hall

Stop in for general Disneyland Park information or to inquire about lost people.

5 Carefree Corner

Sign your name in the Disneyland Guest Book and pick up information on other Southern California attractions at this, your Official Disneyland Information and Registration Center.

6 Baby Center

We offer facilities for preparing formulas, changing diapers, warming bottles and breast-feeding.

7 First Aid and Lost Children

A registered nurse is on duty at all times.

8 Storage Lockers and Lost and Found

Claim lost items here. There are also lockers for storing personal belongings.

9 Fire Engine

This Disneyland version of an early-model fire engine has a honking horn instead of a siren.

10 Horse-Drawn Street Cars

Ride a horse-drawn trolley down the turn-of-the-century thoroughfare.

11 Horseless Carriage

Chug along in a replica of one of America's first automobiles.



12 Omnibus

Take in all the sights on Main Street from atop this double-decker bus.

Note: Main Street vehicles, presented by National Car Rental, provide one-way transportation between Town Square and Central Plaza.

13 Disneyland Railroad

All aboard an old-fashioned steam train for a grand circle tour of Disneyland Park with stops at New Orleans Square, Videopolis—the gateway to Fantasyland, Tomorrowland and a visit to the Grand Canyon and Primeval World.

14 The Walt Disney Story, featuring "Great Moments with Mr. Lincoln"


Fascinating walk-through exhibits honor the man behind the mouse and a theater presentation offers a patriotic salute to the 16th President of the United States.

15 Main Street Cinema

A TREASURE CHEST OF TRIVIA

What follows is a collection of little-known facts, historical items and odd curiosities that can be found throughout the lands of Disneyland Park.

Main Street USA

- ◆ The ornate base of the Town Square flagpole was discovered in 1955 on Wilshire Blvd. at the scene of a traffic accident - a car ran into a lamppost and the base was bought for \$5.00. The flagpole is 65 feet high.
- ◆ The cannons in Town Square were built by Hutchkiss in Paris, France. They are French cannons used by the French Army in the 19th Century.
- ◆ The street lamps on Main Street are 150 years old. They were purchased in Baltimore, Maryland for three cents a pound.
- ◆ The train engines, the C.K. Holliday, E.P. Ripley, Ernest S. Marsh and the Fred Gurley, were all named after the founder and executives of the Santa Fe Railroad.
- ◆ The engine of the first train in the Park was a larger scale reproduction of Walt's toy engine the "Lilly Belle" (named after Walt's wife, Lillian).
- ◆ The antique nickelodeon in the Penny Arcade is an original Welte Sohne Grikeburg I/B Orchestron which was built in the late 19th century. It plays everything from waltzes to ragtime. The music is created by means of perforated paper rolls.
- ◆ Abraham Lincoln's speech in GREAT MOMENTS WITH MR. LINCOLN is actually a composite of various speeches given by Lincoln during his presidency.



Adventureland

- ◆ Original plans for the Jungle Cruise called for real wild animals, but zoologists warned Walt that the animals would always be asleep during operating hours.
- ◆ Jose the Macaw, star of the ENCHANTED TIKI ROOM, used to sit on a perch above the entrance to Adventureland greeting guests. But he was soon removed because he proved too popular and created crowd congestion at the entrance.
- ◆ The fabricated tree that houses the SWISS FAMILY TREEHOUSE is a very rare "species" known as a "Disneydendron."
- ◆ Harper Goff, a scenic designer at Walt Disney Imagineering, based many of the visual elements of THE JUNGLE CRUISE attraction (especially the boats) upon the famous Humphrey Bogart, Katharine Hepburn film, "The African Queen."

New Orleans Square

- ◆ The initials W.E.D. (Walter Elias Disney) and R.O.D. (Roy Oliver Disney) can be found in the wrought iron railing of the Disney Gallery Balcony.
- ◆ Facial designs for the figures in the PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN were modeled after staff members at Walt Disney Imagineering.
- ◆ The One-of-a-Kind Shop was inspired by Mrs. Disney's love of antiques.

Critter Country

- ◆ The Indian Burial Ground on Tom Sawyer Island was originally located in the old Indian Village (present site of Critter Country).
- ◆ The current site of SPLASH MOUNTAIN was formerly the den of a snoring, hibernating bear named Rufus.
- ◆ Critter Country was formerly called Bear Country (1972-1988).

Frontierland

- ◆ The pond along Big Thunder Trail still contains jumping fish left there from the Old Mine Train attraction (1955-?).
- ◆ In the early years of the Park, the Rivers of America was stocked with catfish and fishing was allowed off the docks of TOM SAWYER ISLAND.
- ◆ The maiden voyage of the MARK TWAIN was made before opening day, during Walt's wedding anniversary celebration.
- ◆ The COLUMBIA SAILING SHIP was the first three-masted windjammer built in the United States in over one hundred years.
- ◆ The water tower adjacent to the Frontierland Train Station is an actual, functioning water tower used for Disneyland's authentic steam trains.
- ◆ The first two keelboats at Disneyland Park, the Gullwhumper and the Bertha Mae, were the original boats used in the Disney film, "Davy Crockett and the River Pirates."

Fantasyland

- ◆ Walt Disney's family crest can be seen above the archway at the entrance to SLEEPING BEAUTY CASTLE.
- ◆ 22K gold leafing covers the spires of SLEEPING BEAUTY CASTLE, the mechanisms of the DUMBO FLYING ELEPHANTS and IT'S A SMALL WORLD.
- ◆ 150 year old miniature pine trees inhabit the banks of the STORY BOOK LAND CANAL.
- ◆ Mr. TOAD'S WILD RIDE was originally planned as a roller-coaster type attraction. Walt toned it down, feeling that adults would shy away from such a "wild" Wild ride.
- ◆ The horses of the KING ARTHUR CARROUSEL are 90-110 years old and are classic hand-carved and painted horses with no two exactly alike.
- ◆ The Evil Queen from "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" can often be seen staring out of a window above "Snow White's Scary Adventures."
- ◆ Fantasyland was totally remodeled and reconstructed in 1983, featuring new versions of favorite attractions.

Tomorrowland


- ◆ In the early years of the SUBMARINE VOYAGE, "real" mermaids could be found atop the coral reef of the lagoon.
- ◆ Originally, the AUTOPIA FREEWAY cars were supposed to teach youngsters how to drive safely. The young test drivers reduced the original 36 cars to 6 by smashing into each other. Therefore, large bumpers were incorporated into the design of the cars.

The Disneylandscape

- ◆ Disneyland Park contains plants from over 40 different nations.
- ◆ The eucalyptus trees on the west side of Main Street are over 30 years old.

KODAK PICTURE TIPS FOR Disneyland®

1 For sharp pictures, hold your camera steady as you gently press the shutter release.

2 Add a feeling of depth to your pictures by "framing" the subject with a foreground object such as an arch or tree branch.



3 Personalize your pictures by including friends or family members in the foreground.

4 For natural pictures of people have them involved in a fun activity rather than staring at the camera.



5 Make title pictures for your picture story by photographing identifying signs.

6 Concentrate attention on your main subject by moving in close enough for it to fill the entire viewfinder (check your camera manual for the minimum subject distance).



7 You may want to capture interesting details of subjects by moving in close. With the close-up setting on some Kodak cameras you can get as close as 18 inches.

8 For good flash pictures be sure to keep your subject within the flash distance range for your camera. Flashes are not functional for subjects beyond 50 feet, such as fireworks.

9 If you have a 35mm camera, you can photograph outdoor subjects after sundown and indoor subjects using fast films, such as KODACOLOR GOLD 400 Films (set exposure meter at 400) and KODACOLOR VR 1000 Films (set exposure meter at 1000).


