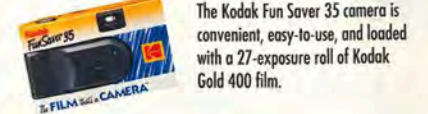

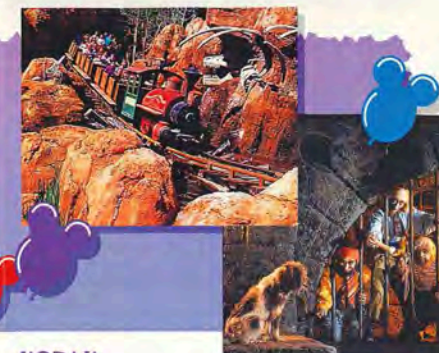

### KODAK PICTURE TIPS

- For sharp pictures, hold your camera steady as you gently press the shutter release.
- Add a feeling of depth to your pictures by "framing" the subject with a foreground object such as an arch or tree branch.
- Personalize your pictures by including friends or family members in the foreground.
- For natural pictures of people have them involved in fun activity rather than staring at the camera.
- Make title pictures for your picture story by photographing identifying signs.
- When the action or a scenic view is larger than your regular camera can handle, try a wide angle lens or the Kodak FunSaver Panoramic 35 camera.
- Concentrate on your subject by moving in close, filling the entire viewfinder (check your camera manual for minimum subject distance). Or capture interesting details with a telephoto lens or Kodak FunSaver Telephoto 35 camera.
- For good flash pictures be sure to keep your subject within the flash distance range for your camera. Flashes are not functional for subjects beyond 50 feet, such as fireworks.
- When light is low and a flash is inappropriate, you can use fast films such as Kodak Gold Plus 400 or 1600 films.

# INFORMATION

Obtain general Disneyland Resort information and information on other Southern California attractions and public transportation at Disneyland City Hall (west side of Town Square) or Bank of Main Street (east side of Town Square).

If you need assistance during your visit, feel free to ask any Disneyland Cast Member. He or she will be more than glad to help you.

For further information about hours, entertainment, special events and Passports, write or call Disneyland Guest Relations, P.O. Box 3332, Anaheim, CA 92803, (714) 999-4565.

**DISNEYLAND PASSPORTS.** Purchase your One - Two - or Three-Day Regular Disneyland Passports and Child Passports (for ages 3-11) at any Main Entrance ticket booth or the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station. American Express, VISA, MasterCard and The Disney Credit Card are accepted. Children two and under are admitted free.

Each Passport provides unlimited use of all attractions (except Arcades). Young children should be accompanied by an adult.

**SENIOR FUN PASSPORT.** Senior 60 or over may purchase a reduced-price Passport any day of the week. Additional discounts are available through the Magic Years Club, which offers travel and leisure benefits to seniors. For more information, write or call Disney's Magic Years Club, P.O. Box 4709, Anaheim, CA 92803, (714) 520-2524.

**GUIDED TOURS.** If it's your first time to Disneyland, or you have a limited amount of time, we'd like to recommend our three-and-a-half-hour guided tour. Discover little-known facts about Walt Disney and his Magic Kingdom and experience several attractions with your Disneyland Host or Hostess.

Foreign language tours are available. Advance reservations for groups of 15 or more are suggested. Please call (714) 999-4575. The Guided Tour ticket, which is not included in the unlimited use Passport, is available for purchase at City Hall and at the Main Entrance ticket booths.

Note: Length of tour may vary depending on wait time for attractions. All tours are subject to availability.

**BIRTHDAY PARTIES.** You may celebrate a birthday at Disneyland with Characters, birthday cake, ice cream, party favors and special surprises for the birthday person at the Space Place in Tomorrowland. Advance reservations are recommended. Contact The Walt Disney Travel Company at (714) 520-5915. Same-day requests are accommodated based on space availability. Please inquire at The Space Place Reservation Counter. Operates daily, June 18 through September 5 and Saturdays and Sundays the balance of the year.

**DISNEY DOLLARS.** Use Disney Dollars throughout Disneyland and the Disneyland Hotel. Disney Dollars are available in \$1, \$5, and \$10 denominations at a one-for-one exchange rate with U.S. currency. Disney Dollars may be purchased at all ticket booths, City Hall, the Bank of Main Street, most Park merchandise locations and the front desk of the Disneyland Hotel. Cash in the fan!

**RESERVATIONS.** Same-day reservations are available for selected Disneyland and Disneyland Hotel restaurants, as well as Disneyland shows, on a limited basis at the Guest Relations Reservations Center located in the lobby of The Walt Disney Story on Main Street. (Open on selected weekends and seasonal periods only.) Direct dial reservation phones for the Hotel are located in City Hall and Lost & Found, located on Main Street, U.S.A.

**AMERICAN EXPRESS.** American Express is the Official Credit Card of Disneyland and is accepted at the Main Entrance and in many of the shops, stores and restaurants. A 24-hour ATM is available in the Transportation of the Disneyland Hotel.

**AUTOMATED TELLER MACHINES (ATM).** Located for your convenience outside the Main Entrance near the lockers, inside the Bank of Main Street, in the Frontierland stockade near the telephone, in the Premier Shop, in the Penny Arcade on Main Street, U.S.A., the Sarcade in Tomorrowland and at the Disneyland Hotel Transportation.

**CHECK CASHING/FOREIGN CURRENCY.** Personal checks may be written for the amount of purchase. With proper identification, you may cash checks at the Penny Arcade on Main Street, U.S.A., and the Sarcade in Tomorrowland.

Foreign currency may be presented for most purchases at the Disneyland Resort for the current exchange rate or exchanged at the Penny Arcade, Main Street U.S.A. and the Sarcade in Tomorrowland for U.S. funds.

**CREDIT CARDS.** American Express, The Disney Credit Card, VISA and MasterCard are accepted at the Main Entrance and in many shops, stores and restaurants.

**MERCHANDISE SERVICES.** Complimentary package pick-up is offered throughout the Disneyland Resort. Park guests may leave their purchases at one of our shops and pick them up at the Redemption Center on Main Street (across from Town Square) in the afternoon. Disneyland Hotel guests may have their purchases delivered directly to their room free of charge. Please ask a Merchandise Host/Hostess for assistance. A wide variety of Disneyland merchandise may be ordered by mail. For more information, write or call Merchandise Guest Services, 1313 Harbor Blvd., P.O. Box 3332, Anaheim, CA 92803-3332, (800) 360-4533.

**FIRST AID.** Located at the east end of Main Street next to the Plaza Inn. A registered nurse is on duty at all times.

**SPECIAL SERVICES FOR GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES.** Accommodations have been made throughout Disneyland for guests with disabilities. For specific information, obtain your copy of the Guidebook For Guests with Disabilities at City Hall, Stroller and Wheelchair Rental or the Bank of Main Street.

**STROLLER AND WHEELCHAIR RENTALS.** A limited number of stroller and wheelchair rentals are available for a nominal charge and refundable deposit. They are located on the east side of the Disneyland Main Entrance, just inside the gate.

**KENNEL CLUB, HOSTED BY FRISKIES.** Board your pet for a nominal charge in the Disneyland Kennel, which is east of the Disneyland Main Entrance. Pets, no facilities for overnight accommodations.

**LOST & FOUND/STORAGE LOCKERS.** Claim your lost items at Lost and Found, located on the east side of Main Street, around the corner from the Market House.

A limited number of lockers for storing garments, personal belongings and purchases are located adjacent to Lost & Found, halfway down Main Street behind the Market House and next to the Vidulaps rest rooms. Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Parking Lot Tram stop, west of the Disneyland Main Entrance.

**LOST CHILDREN.** Pick up your lost child at the Lost Children Center, located at the east end of Main Street next to First Aid. You can also make inquiries at City Hall.

**BABY CARE CENTER, HOSTED BY CARNATION INFANT FORMULA.** Located on the east end of Main Street between Carefree Corner and First Aid, the Baby Care Center provides facilities for preparing formulas, warming bottles, nursing and changing diapers. Disposable diapers and a limited selection of baby food are available at the Emporium or Market House (Main Street). Diapers are also available at the Stroller and Wheelchair Rentals (Main Entrance), Star Trader (Tomorrowland) and Marche aux Fleurs (New Orleans Square) and in the Women's rest room in Mickey's Toontown, City Hall, New Orleans Square and Space Mountain, and the Men's rest room in City Hall. Sorry, baby-sitting is not available.

**TIPS TO MAKE YOUR VISIT MORE PLEASANT**  
Enjoy your day at Disneyland to the fullest with these time and energy-saving suggestions:  
**ATTRICTIONS.** No matter what the season, the best time to see the most popular attractions is early in the day (before noon) and just before closing.  
 Also, plan on dining early or late so you'll avoid the lunch and dinner rushes.  
 The shops on Main Street are usually the busiest at that time.  
 The descriptions on the reverse side will help you decide what attractions you'd like to see, where you might want to eat and which shops you'd like to browse through. The Park may be a helpful guide.  
 Your Passport entitles you to unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except Arcades).  
**SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS.** Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times in Disneyland. We request that no food or beverages be brought into Disneyland. A picnic area is located west of the Main Entrance for your convenience. Also, for the comfort of those around you, we request that there be no flash photography, eating or drinking in any attractions.  
 Attention young at heart! Splash Mountain, Space Mountain, Star Tours, Mattheon Bobbleheads, Gadget's Go Coaster, Big Thunder Mountain Railroad, Rocket Jets, Goofy's Bounce House, Chip 'n Dale Acorn Crawl and Antopia have boarding restrictions. Guests should be in good health and free from heart, back or neck problems, motion sickness or other conditions that could be aggravated by these adventures. Expectant mothers and children under three should not ride. See a host or Hostess at these attractions for more information.  
 For your safety and convenience at parade time, please honor designated parade viewing areas and use designated crosswalks.

**REENTRY TO DISNEYLAND.** If you wish to leave Disneyland and return the same day during regular operating hours, either via the Main Entrance or the Monorail Station at the Disneyland Hotel, a valid Disneyland Passport and a hand stamp are required for re-admission. You may also reenter the Parking Lot on the same day (free of charge) if you retain your parking receipt and present it at the Guest Parking Entrance.

**DISNEY CHARACTERS.** Mickey Mouse can be found filming movies in his Movie Barn at Mickey's Toontown. Most of his pals can be found strolling the neighborhood as well as Town Square and the Central Plaza area. Just keep your eyes open and your camera ready.

**PHOTO PROCESSING BY FOX PHOTO.** Drop off your film at various locations throughout the Park and at the Disneyland Hotel for two-hour or next-day processing by Fox Photo. You may pick up your prints at the Camera Center on Main Street or in the Monorail Plaza at the Disneyland Hotel.

**PARKING.** Please mark your parking location on the map shown below to avoid confusion when leaving Disneyland. There is no overnight parking at Disneyland.

**FOOD.** Snacks, food and beverages cannot be brought into the Park. For your convenience, a picnic area is located on the west side of the Main Entrance.

**SMOKING.** For the consideration of others, we ask that guests refrain from smoking in all attractions, shops, restaurants, and in popular open-air areas (e.g., parades, stage shows, etc.).

## MAIN STREET, U.S.A.

- 1 **Disneyland Railroad.** Disembark at New Orleans Square, Tomorrowland or Mickey's Toontown — the land that Toons built — or ride round-trip.
- 2 **Fire Engine.** This Disneyland version of an early model fire engine has a honking horn instead of a siren.
- 3 **Horse-Drawn Street Cars.** Ride a horse-drawn trolley down the turn-of-the-century thoroughfare.
- 4 **Horseless Carriage.** Chug along in a replica of one of America's first automobiles.
- 5 **Main Street Cinema.** Watch Mickey Mouse, Minnie Mouse and the rest of the Disney gang in cartoon classics on six different screens.
- 6 **Omnibus.** Take in all the sights on Main Street from atop this double-decker bus. Note: *Main Street vehicles, presented by National Interrent, provide one-way transportation between Town Square and the Central Plaza.*
- 7 **Penny Arcade.** Games, fortunes and old movies are still a penny, nickel, dime or quarter. [E]
- 8 **The Walt Disney Story, featuring Great Moments with Mr. Lincoln.** Fascinating walk-through exhibits honor the man behind the mouse and a theater presentation offers a patriotic salute to the 16th President of the United States.

## ADVENTURELAND

- 1 **Enchanted Tiki Room, presented by Dole Pineapple.** Birds, flowers and tiki are alive with the sound of music in this charming tropical revue. Please check at attraction entrance for show times.
- 2 **Jungle Cruise.** Take an exciting adventure down the tropical rivers of the world.
- 3 **Swiss Family Treehouse.** The treetop home of the Robinson family was built when they were shipwrecked on a deserted isle.

## NEW ORLEANS SQUARE

- 1 **The Disney Gallery: Now Showing "The Art of Indiana Jones" Adventure** and "The Art of Euro Disneyland." Browse through the rare Disneyland collection of original artist paintings.
- 2 **Disneyland Railroad.** Disembark at Mickey's Toontown — the land that Toons built — or travel to Tomorrowland, Main Street, U.S.A. or ride round-trip.
- 3 **Haunted Mansion.** The 999 "happy haunts" in the old house on the hill are simply dying to have you join them.
- 4 **Pirates of the Caribbean.** A pirate's life awaits you on the wildest adventure ever to rock the Spanish Main.

## CRITTER COUNTRY

- 1 **Country Bear Playhouse.** A foot-stompin', knee-slappin' vacation hoodown featuring those unbearably funny "bear-iones." Please check at entrance for show times.
- 2 **Davy Crockett's Explorer Canoes.** Paddle your way around the Rivers of America with a wilderness guide. Check at the landing for excursion times.
- 3 **Teddi Barra's Swingin' Arcade.** Get your change ready for frontier-themed fun and games.
- 4 **Splash Mountain.** Watch your life splash before your eyes with the steepest, highest, scariest, wildest, wettest Disneyland adventure. The only way out is a long way down.

## FANTASYLAND

- 1 **Alice in Wonderland.** Don't be late for this very important date with Alice and the White Rabbit.
- 2 **Casey Jr. Circus Train.** The "little train who knew he could" takes a trip around Storybook Land.
- 3 **Disneyland Railroad, Mickey's Toontown Train Depot.** Disembark in Tomorrowland, Main Street, U.S.A. or New Orleans Square — or ride round-trip.
- 4 **Dumbo the Flying Elephant.** No doubt about it, this elephant can fly.
- 5 **"It's a Small World," presented by Mattel Toys.** It's the happiest little cruise that ever sailed around the world.
- 6 **King Arthur Carrousel.** Ride one of 72 prancing white horses.
- 7 **Mad Tea Party.** Spinning cups and saucers whirl, twirl and swirl.
- 8 **Matterhorn Bobsleds.** Hold onto your lederhosen for a thrilling ride and an icy encounter with the Abominable Snowman.
- 9 **Mr. Toad's Wild Ride.** Take a reckless joyride on the road to "nowhere in particular." Strobe lights are used as special effects in part of this attraction.
- 10 **Peter Pan's Flight.** Pirate galleons soar past the second star on the right and straight on till morning.
- 11 **Pinocchio's Daring Journey.** Pinocchio finds Pleasure Island isn't so pleasurable.
- 12 **Skyway to Tomorrowland.** Take a one-way journey high above the Magic Kingdom.
- 13 **Snow White's Scary Adventures.** Heigh-ho, heigh-ho, it's off to the Wicked Witch's castle we go.
- 14 **Storybook Land Canal Boats.** Classic fairy tales in miniature grace beautifully landscaped waterways.
- 15 **Videopolis.** presented by Sony. Check the entertainment schedule list of events for this outdoor amphitheater.

## FRONTIERLAND

- 1 **Big Thunder Mountain Railroad.** Thrills and spills on a runaway mine train make it the wildest ride in the West.
- 2 **Big Thunder Ranch.** The Old West homestead features a log cabin, horses and burros, stables, petting barnyard and a harness maker. (Petting barnyard closes at dusk.)
- 3 **Fantasmic!** See Mickey's imagination run wild in this Disneyland nighttime spectacular. Brace yourself as towering monsters and heroes rise out of the Rivers of America in a furious clash of good vs. evil! Check show schedule in this guide.
- 4 **Frontierland Shootin' Arcade.** Shoot up Boot Hill and see what happens.
- 5 **Golden Horseshoe, hosted by Wonder Bread.** This song-and-dance revue stars Miss Lily and Sam the Bartender. Make your reservations.
- 6 **Mark Twain Riverboat.** A stately steam-powered stern-wheeler cruises the waters of the Rivers of America. Check at the Frontierland Landing for sailing times.
- 7 **Rafes to Tom Sawyer Island.** It's a short trip across the river to fun with balancing rocks, secret caves and a barrel bridge. Tom and Huck never had it so good. Check at the landing for closing time.

## MICKEY'S TOONTOWN

- 1 **Chip 'n Dale Tree Slide and Acorn Crawl.** Kids, go nuts in the home of your favorite pint-size Disney friends. Climb up the tree and slide down to the fun. There are acorn balls from wall to wall.
- 2 **Gadget's Go Coaster.** It's Gadget's latest invention. Hop into an acorn car for a zippy journey through a wilderness tunnel, a splash-down in Toon Lake and a spin under some wacky, squirting frogs!
- 3 **Goofy's Bounce House.** Kick off your shoes and let the good times roll... and bump... and jump in his crazy Bounce House.
- 4 **Jolly Trolley.** It's Toontown's own rapid transit! You can travel from Downtown Toontown to Mickey's Neighborhood or back.
- 5 **Mickey's House and Meet Mickey.** Explore the house of Toontown's most famous resident. See Mickey's den, visit his garden; there are laughs the moment you walk in. After you see Mickey's House, take a tour of his backyard Movie Barn. Discover props and costumes from his past movies. Watch film footage of his daily filmings, then visit with him — in person — on the set of one of his cartoons.
- 6 **Minnie's House.** Warm your heart with the sweet charm of Minnie's House. Plus, don't forget to visit her backyard wishing well.
- 7 **"Miss Daisy," Donald's Boat.** Climb aboard the tooniest boat afloat! Blow the whistle or ring the bell. And get a bird's-eye view of Toontown through the periscope.
- 8 **Roger Rabbit's Car Toon Spin — NEW!** Step into the back alleys of the Toontown Cab Co., and run into zany characters around every turn. Then, catch a cab, and try to escape the villainous weasels and their dreaded dip. Strobe lights are used as special effects in part of this attraction.

- 2 **Disneyland Monorail.** The transportation system of tomorrow travels round-trip to the Disneyland Hotel.
- 3 **Disneyland Railroad.** Disembark at Main Street, U.S.A., New Orleans Square or Mickey's Toontown — the land that Toons built — or ride round-trip.
- 4 **Magic Eye Theater, presented by Kodak.** Our feature attraction is Captain EO, a high-tech, 3-D musical motion picture space adventure starring Michael Jackson. Please check at the entrance for show times. Strobe lights are used as special effects in part of this attraction.
- 5 **PeopleMover.** Move through rooftop views of Tomorrowland and catch glimpses of several exciting attractions.
- 6 **Rocket Jets.** Take off on a soaring aerial adventure high above Tomorrowland.
- 7 **Skyway to Fantasyland.** Enjoy a bird's-eye view of Disneyland on a one-way trip to Fantasyland.
- 8 **Space Mountain, presented by Federal Express.** Blast-off on a warp-speed adventure through the far reaches of the universe. Strobe lights are used as special effects in part of this attraction.
- 9 **Starcade.** Discover a stellar experience on two floors of the most popular video games. [E]
- 10 **Star Tours.** Experience the ultimate thrill adventure from the creative forces of Disney and George Lucas.
- 11 **Submarine Voyage.** An underwater cruise to the North Pole and back.
- 12 **Tomorrowland Autopia.** Take a pleasant drive through the scenic side of Tomorrowland.

## DISNEYLAND HOTEL

- 1 **Disneyland Monorail.** The transportation system of tomorrow travels to Disneyland or round-trip. Ticket booth location.

- 3 **Koi Fish.** Hand-feed beautifully colored Koi fish, daily.
- 4 **Neon Cactus.** Live Country music Wednesday – Sunday, beginning at 9 p.m. Kick up your heels with the line dance instructor Monday and Tuesday, beginning at 8 p.m.
- 5 **Off-Road Raceway.** Remote-controlled mini-racers zoom around a challenging course.
- 6 **Pedal Boats (closes at dusk).** Ride around the Marina in pedal-powered two-seat boats.
- 7 **Queen's Berth.** Remote-controlled tugboats chug around a replica of the Queen Mary.
- 8 **Video Adventure.** Test your skills at our family arcade.
